PASTOR POINT **From the desk of: Pastor Kathy Tessin**

I am writing this first letter to all of you after the excitement of July 21st, and the congregation's affirmation to call me to serve First Presbyterian, Port Huron as your Minister of Word and Sacrament. It was such a blessing to help lead worship and proclaim the gospel for you this past Sunday. Thank you for your gracious welcome, and all your prayers and good wishes. I am excited to get started working alongside of you on August 5th!



My youngest brother, Scott, sent this scripture passage to me the next morning, Phillipians 3:14. It reads, "I press on to reach the end of the race and receive the heavenly prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us." He was gently kidding me – Paul was not referring to the lengthy and rigorous Presbyterian ordination and call process when he wrote these words in the first century! But putting kidding aside, I reflected upon these words in my devotional time today. I have been striving to prepare for a call to serve God through ministry for over four years. So, this past weekend did feel a bit like finishing a long marathon. But now that this milestone has been reached – a new beginning is in front of me. Our mortal lives are filled with endings and beginnings, which bring with them a variety of emotions. New beginnings are exciting – and exhausting. They raise curiosity – and create concern over what might be lost in the newness of this phase of life.

I've learned that First Presbyterian has been around in various forms and buildings in Port Huron for over 155 years and has served Port Huron from its current location for 129 years. That is a long marathon! Many changes have been experienced by this hard-working congregation of Presbyterians in that span of time. But one consistent goal threads through all the years and activity: answering the call of God, through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, to learn the Word and serve others as Jesus modeled in his life and ministry. Serving our risen Lord is the goal of the race we are running, and the prize is to be in communion with our Triune God through eternity. We'll keep running short sprints as a church – the mission yard sale and Vacation Bible Camp will soon be here! But through the various races of life, let's always remember the reason for it all is to testify to the power of the living Christ in all our words and activity. I look forward to running alongside you soon on this next stage in the journey!

PASTOR POINT From the desk of: Pastor Roxie Davis

I echo the words of Pastor Kathy as she speaks about marathons. As many of you know, my middle single daughter, Christina, has run more than 25 marathons around the world, in places that some of us will never see. I had the privilege to be at several of those marathons, including the one in Boston. Marathons are exhilarating and exhausting. But they are worth it when the runner finishes the 26.1 mile race and out of pure joy, the runner says: "I finished the race!" Pastor Kathy quoted the Apostle Paul in Philippians 3:16: "I press on to reach the end of the race and receive the heavenly prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us." What great joy it will be, through faith, we receive that heavenly prize.

Pastor Kathy is joining you in the amazing marathon which this church has run for so many years. She will run alongside you, encourage you, pray with you and love you. And I know, from experience, you will do the same for her. My marathon with you for the last 3 ½ years has given me energy that I really never knew I had; it has taught me lots about the workings of God in our lives and it has revealed to me the joyful strength God has given us, as we run together, "for the common goal: to testify to the power of the living Christ in all our words and activity."

My marathon with you here at First Presbyterian Church has come to a close. I have finished the race and enjoyed it immensely. Now I will take my place in the stands, cheering you and Pastor Kathy on, knowing that God has other plans for me. The exciting thing is, no matter what race we are running, God in Jesus Christ is always out there in front of us, beaconing us with His words: "I will never leave you." May you have blessings of energy and joy as you run your marathon for God.

Our New GIFT Friends!

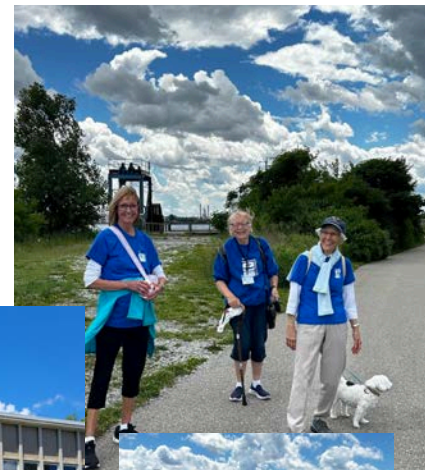

THANK YOU, ONE AND ALL

The Mission Committee would like to thank everyone who participated and contributed to our CROP Walk on June 9 and the annual Habitat for Humanity Nail Sale on June 16.

- The CROP Walk for Hunger, which included several Old Town churches as well as Lakeshore Presbyterian, drew about 35 walkers who spent a warm and sunny afternoon enjoying the beauty of Port Huron's Riverwalk and the company of others to fight food insecurity in our community and around the world. The walk raised **\$3,610**, with more than \$2,300 given by members, families and friends of this church. Of the total raised, 25% (more than **\$900**) will remain in our community to benefit the weekly Food Pantry at St. John's United Church of Christ.
- The men who donned aprons for our annual Father's Day Nail Sale collection raised **\$954** to benefit Port Huron's Habitat for Humanity chapter and won bragging rights in the ongoing friendly competition between the sexes. On Mother's Day, the women donned their aprons to collect money for the city's two women's shelters and raised **\$671**. Remember though, guys, there is always next year.

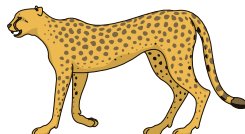

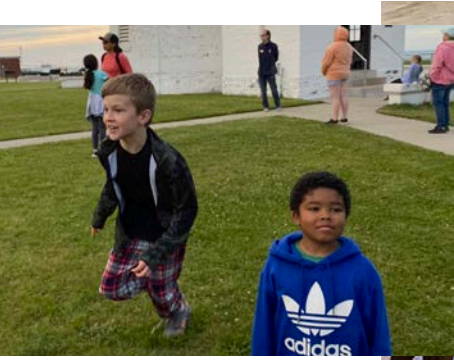

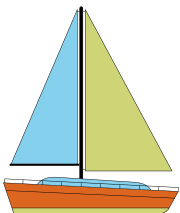

“LET JUSTICE ROLL DOWN”

Throughout Scripture, Christians have been called upon by God to care for their neighbors and all creation. Verse after verse tell us not to pervert justice due the poor (Exodus 13:6), render unjust judgment (Leviticus 19:15) or fail to pursue justice and only justice (Deuteronomy 16:20). And yes, today, the Presbyterian Church has become a keen advocate for racial equality, the rights of women, gender equality and social justice, both here and globally. Yet, like most of our society, Christians have neglected environmental justice.

With this thought in mind, the Sarah Circle will begin in September a nine-month study of environmental justice. The title is taken from the book of Amos, Chapter 5:24: “But let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream.” Topics will include:

- Biblical understanding of land and food;
- Toxic water and its impacts;
- Climate change and how it relates to pollution
- The invaluable gifts the ecosystem gives us.
